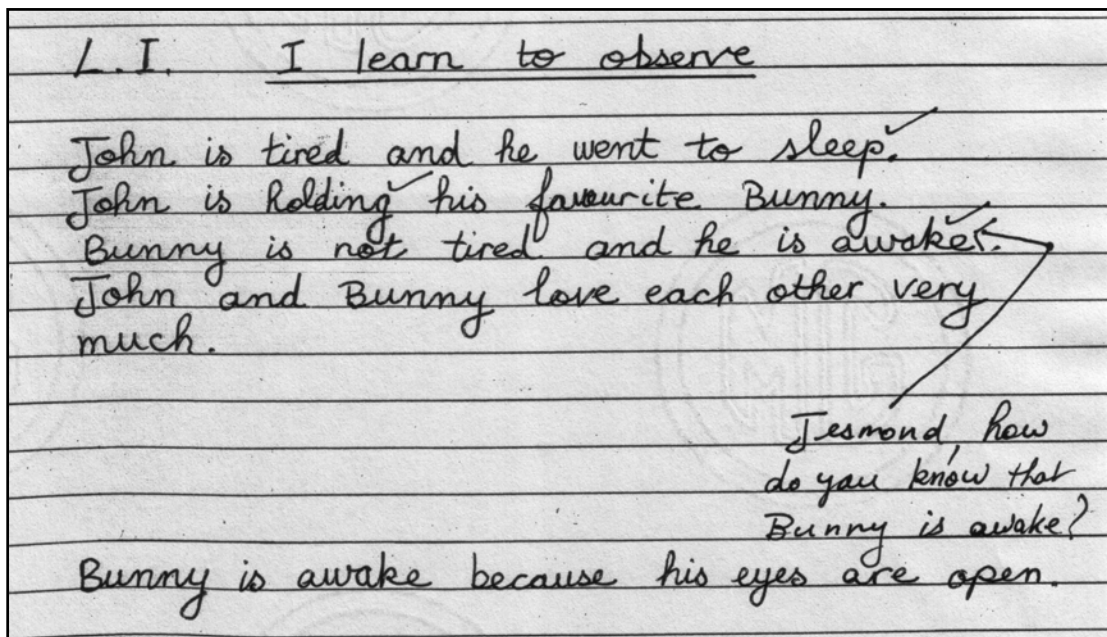


L.I. I learn to observe
